# **Check List**

The Wedding Ceremony

The Wedding Ceremony is a religious service of worship; therefore, all preparations and arrangements leading to and becoming a part of this ceremony should be made with this in mind. By choosing to be married in the sanctuary, you are affirming that you want your wedding to have some religious significance, and all aspects of the ceremony must reflect this orientation.

### **Arranging Your Wedding**

Your wedding style should reflect your desires, and may be determined by the number of guests or the size of your budget. The time of your wedding often determines how formal it will be. While informal weddings can be performed at almost any time of the day, formal weddings usually begin after 5pm. If possible, our pastors prefer to begin weddings no later than 5:30pm

Here at Dixboro Church, we are eager to make your wedding a memorable and beautiful occasion and are prepared to assist you in every way possible. In order to avoid any misunderstanding, our policy is to discuss wedding arrangements only with the bride and groom (not a wedding consultant or family members). Inside this booklet, you will find the names and telephone numbers of the persons you will need to talk to regarding various aspects of your wedding. Please note that it is your responsibility to initiate those conversations.

First you will want to contact the Church Office at 734-665-5632 to confirm that the sanctuary is available on your desired wedding date. The Church Office will also answer any questions regarding fees. If your date is available, the Church Office will contact our ministers to determine which of them will officiate at your wedding. Then you will need to contact the minister assigned to you (6-8 months prior to your wedding) to schedule an introductory meeting.

#### Fees

Our Administrative Assistant will be happy to provide you with our current Fee Schedule. A deposit of one half of the total fees is due within 30 days after your wedding date has been confirmed. Your date will not be guaranteed until the deposit has been received. This deposit is non-refundable. The balance of the remaining fees and the marriage license must be brought to the Church Office at least one week prior to the wedding.

### The Pastor

Once your wedding date is confirmed and you've made the necessary deposit, then it is your responsibility to contact your assigned parish clergy to discuss your wedding arrangements and begin pre-marital counseling (preferably about six months prior to the wedding). United Methodist church law requires that a Dixboro clergy officiate at all weddings at Dixboro Church. Inviting additional guest clergy is generally discouraged, but may be allowed, subject to our pastor's discretion. If you wish to request that another clergy person participate with the Dixboro minister in your ceremony, you must first contact the DUMC minister, who will extend the invitation to such other clergy person.

No wedding will be conducted at Dixboro without pre-marital counseling. Generally, we require at least three sessions over a 4-6 month period, so be sure to contact the officiating minister well in advance of your ceremony.

As a courtesy to our parish clergy, if you would like them to share in your celebration at a rehearsal dinner or reception, please specifically invite them well in advance. Do be aware that their schedules may not allow them to participate.

### The Wedding Coordinator

Our Church Wedding Coordinator is prepared to work with you from the time you book your wedding at Dixboro, until after the ceremony at the church. However, if you wish to secure your own Wedding Planner, our Wedding Coordinator will be happy to work with them. It is our church's policy that our Coordinator must at least be present for your Rehearsal and Wedding. Wedding Coordinator's duties are as follows:

- Meet with the bride and groom to discuss Sanctuary set-up.
- Meet with your Wedding Planner (if you hired one) to review and approve plans and provide help and information.
- On the day of your rehearsal, coordinator will open and close the building and help you finalize placements of floral arrangements, unity candles and candelabras.
- On the day of the wedding, the coordinator will open and close the building, and direct the florist and other personnel associated with the church wedding decorations.
- After the wedding, coordinator will assist wedding party in removing all items from the church and ensure the building is in order for Sunday services.

#### Music

A church wedding is a sacred rite invoking the blessing of God on the founding of a marriage. As such, the music should reflect and intensify the mood and meaning of the service and direct our thoughts toward God. Whether you prefer sacred or secular music in a traditional or contemporary style, please remember that all music in your wedding ceremony should be fitting for a worship setting.

Our Music Director is responsible for all music in the service and will assist you in selecting the music. You will want to confirm the Music Director's availability well in advance of your wedding. The Music Director has a great wealth of music available for the wedding ceremony and will gladly help you with additional material for soloists and instrumentalists. If you wish to invite your own musicians to participate in your wedding, you must speak to our Music Director about your intentions. The wedding fee includes the services of the Music Director at one meeting to plan the wedding music, at the rehearsal and at the ceremony. Other musical services may be available and the cost of these will be negotiated in discussion with the Music Director.

### Drug, Alcohol and Tobacco Policy

Please note that United Methodist Church policy prohibits alcoholic beverages and the use of recreational drugs in the church or on church property. Persons appearing under the influence at the rehearsal or ceremony may cause cancellation of the ceremony in the church.

This is a smoke-free environment. This includes the church building, the parking lot, and the Village Green.

NOTE: Wedding couples are responsible for informing their guests of our policy.

### **Sanctuary Decorations**

A church wedding is a service of worship and consecration. The church will be decorated and used in keeping with the atmosphere of a place of worship. The sanctuary can comfortably fit approximately 125 people and up to 150 with extra chairs and tighter seating. Plans for floral arrangements and other details will be made with the Wedding Coordinator in advance of ordering. Flowers, decorations, or candelabras should be placed so as not to dominate. Altar arrangements are not to be higher than the arms of the cross that is on the altar. Most couples take the flowers to the reception, but if you wish to leave any flowers for the Sunday service, please notify the Wedding Coordinator. Candles may only be used on the altar or the side of the altar in additional candle stands. Decorations for the pews may only be tied in place or attached with elastic, not with tape. If you are using rose petals or bird seed after the ceremony, please do not pass them out until you are outside and couple is about to exit.

The following articles may be available for your use, courtesy of the Altar Guild. Discuss with the Wedding Coordinator if you are interested in any of these items:

- White parchments for the altar.
- Kneeling bench.
- Two additional tall candle stands. (You supply the necessary 14 dripless white dinner size candles at the rehearsal.)
- Unity or wedding candle holder. (You supply the candle.)
- Flower containers which may be used by your florist and flower stands.

### Your Marriage License

The marriage license must be obtained in the county where either the bride or groom legally resides, but it may be used in any county in Michigan. You will need to apply for your license in person at your county building. It is recommended you call your county building at least six weeks prior to your wedding to learn what identification documents they require; whether or not there is a waiting period between application and receipt of your license and how many days the license is valid. County offices are not open on weekends.

Please bring the marriage license, with the final payment, to the church office at least one week before your wedding date. At that time, you will need to write out the names of the two people (over 18) who will serve as your witnesses. Make sure the legal names are spelled correctly. These witnesses must be present at both the rehearsal and the wedding ceremony. You are not officially married until the pastor performing the ceremony and two witnesses have signed the license. The witnesses and the bride and groom will sign the license after the wedding service. NOTE: We cannot legally perform your marriage ceremony without a marriage license.

### The Wedding Rehearsal

The rehearsal is your insurance that everything is ready and all your attendants are present and informed as to their participation. Generally, the rehearsal takes place the night before the service and lasts about 60-90 minutes. The date and hour of the rehearsal should be set when arranging for the date of the marriage service.

The officiating pastor and our wedding coordinator will conduct your rehearsal. It is important that ALL members involved in the service be present as well as parents of the bride and groom, and those who will be reading lessons or prayers and ushers. The two legal witnesses must be present at the rehearsal.

The couple will arrive fifteen minutes before the rehearsal and certify the final details of the service with the minister. In order to begin on time, the wedding party is to arrive a few minutes early.

If you are choosing to use the candle stands (see Sanctuary Decorations), please bring the candles to the rehearsal.

# Photographer(s)

Your wedding photographer will be welcome, but not required, at the rehearsal. On the wedding day, he or she must meet with the minister upon arriving at the church. We require that flash pictures NOT be taken during the service as they will detract from the focus on the couple and the occasion. Available light photos may be taken from the back of the church. Parts of the ceremony can be restaged afterward for specific close-ups. Videotaping is an option. As a courtesy to your guests, the officiating pastor must pre-approve placement of video and photography equipment during the ceremony. Due to safety issues, photographers will be prohibited from setting up any equipment in the center aisle.
